Care & Cleaning

Your new closets and cabinets were meticulously inspected to ensure they meet the highest standards of quality before reaching your home. To keep them looking as stunning as the day they were installed, simply follow these care instructions and recommendations.

Product Surfaces

The door face frames and any stained or painted portions of your cabinetry are crafted with a high-quality finish designed to protect and preserve the natural beauty of the wood. The interiors and exposed ends of standard constructions feature a durable laminate material, engineered to resist rub marks and contain minor spills. (Please note that construction details may vary based on the selected options and features. For specific information about your cabinetry's construction, consult your designer.) To maintain the pristine appearance of your cabinets, we recommend cleaning them at least once a month.

Forceful Maneuver

Avoid closing cabinet doors or drawers quickly or forcefully, as the impact may cause damage to both the cover and the cabinet body.



Hardware/Accessory Replacement

If metal hardware or accessories on your cabinets become unusable, we recommend replacing them carefully using the appropriate tools. This will help prevent damage or cracks in the screw openings. Alternatively, contact a professional team for assistance to ensure proper handling and installation.



Surface Cleaning

When cleaning the surfaces, do not use any cleaning material with harmful chemical substances, as this could cause wear on the surfaces of your products.

Use a mildly wet soft cloth or duster with a small amount of liquid soap (e.g. diluted dish soap) for cleaning. Using a spray bottle would be an even better method. Make sure to dry the surfaces as soon as possible to avoid the wear on the surfaces of your products. You could also purchase maintenance solutions for cleaning, but make sure that it is appropriate for your items.



Cleaning with Water

Avoid using excessive amounts of water during cleaning, even if your closets and cabinets are labeled as waterproof. Prolonged exposure to water can cause swelling in the cabinet bodies and covers, diminishing both the aesthetic appeal and the quality of the wood material.

After cleaning, ensure surfaces are dried immediately to prevent water damage or wear. Water infiltration through small openings at the sides and corners of veneered surfaces can also lead to rusting of metal components and the core material.

For kitchen or vanity base cabinets, ensure a protective countertop (e.g., marble, Corian, etc.) is installed to safeguard the cabinetry from moisture and other potential damage.

You may also use specialized maintenance solutions, but always verify their compatibility with your items before application.



Rusting

If rust develops on metal hardware or accessories, you may use rust removers. However, take care to prevent these products from coming into contact with the wooden parts of your closets. To ensure proper functionality of metal components, such as hinges, regular lubrication is recommended. However, if the hardware has been in use for many years and shows significant wear, replacing the parts is a more effective solution.



Environment

To prevent damage, keep your cabinets and closets away from environments with high humidity, extreme temperatures, intense sunlight, and excessive water exposure. If minor defects appear on the surfaces and can be treated with touch-ups, ensure you have a clear understanding of the item's general properties and wood type. Contact the manufacturer or provider for guidance before attempting any repairs.



Load Capacity

Avoid placing excessively heavy items on top of your units, shelves, or drawers, as this can lead to deformation and may cause the wood to crack or break. The same caution applies to rods and racks, as heavy loads can cause the metal components to bend or become damaged. For optimal performance and longevity, distribute weight evenly and avoid overloading your storage units.



Water Infiltration

In the event of flooding caused by weather conditions (such as rainwater infiltrating from windows) or mechanical issues, it is crucial to act quickly. Ensure that any items touching the ground, such as the base of your closets or cabinets, are kept away from water as soon as possible. Prompt action will help prevent damage to the bottom parts of your furniture and preserve its integrity.



Removal from Surfaces

If something is stuck on the surfaces, avoid using abrasive tools, as these can leave scratches, marks, or damage the protective coating. Instead, use lint-free cloths or soft sponges to gently clean the affected areas.
